



Aquarium Guest Policy

The safety and well-being of our guests, staff members and animals are a top priority.

Please note these policies when visiting the New England Aquarium:

Bag Size

Any bag larger than 12" x 12" x 12" will not be permitted, with the exception of diaper bags and carriers for medical supplies. Bags, strollers, backpacks and packages are subject to inspection.

Firearms

Firearms are not allowed on Aquarium property, with the exception of law enforcement and on-duty security personnel.

Prohibited Items

- Weapons
- Signs
- Alcoholic beverages
- Food, drink and gum (in exhibit areas)
- Clothing with offensive or vulgar language
- Illegal drugs
- Laser pens and pointers
- Noise-making devices (horns, whistles, etc.)
- Balloons
- Any other items deemed to be dangerous or inappropriate



Prohibited Behavior and Code of Conduct

 Distributing any literature or propaganda, soliciting for signatures and/or the selling of any goods and services is not allowed on Aquarium property unless authorized by New England Aquarium.




- All tobacco products and e-cigarettes are prohibited on Aquarium grounds. The Aquarium is a smoke-free environment.
- Courteous behavior is expected of all guests.
- Unruly or unsafe behavior that endangers people or animals, disrupts other guests' ability to enjoy their visit or interferes with business operations will not be tolerated and can result in ejection without a refund and/or prosecution to the full extent of the law*.

*Such behavior includes, but is not limited to, attempting to enter the building with prohibited items listed above; smoking; offensive or disorderly conduct; throwing any object; entering or attempting to enter pools or exhibits; failure to follow the instructions of Aquarium personnel; actions that might harm or endanger people or animals; and any other conduct that is deemed inappropriate in a public setting.





































Elevators are accessible by anyone including parents with strollers and the handicapped.




Front Plaza Services & Eateries


Turtle Odyssey: Bunji's Big Adventure narrated by Russell Crowe (45 minutes)

Giant half-ton long-necked tortoises lumber among dancing blue-footed boobies and flightless cormorants. Penguins living thwousands of miles from their natural habitats share the seas with unique marine iguanas that spit sea-salt. This is a story of discovery, of survival against the odds, and of nature's ingenuity.

At Your Aquatic Leisure

What is Living Blue?

Living blue means making daily changes – big and small – that help protect the environment. Oceans cover 70% of the world, so ultimately the actions we take in our daily lives will affect the health of our oceans. Below are actions you can take as a family to help protect our blue planet.

Family *Live Blue*™ Action List

- Turn the lights off when you leave a room.
- Reduce water use by turning faucets off and taking shorter showers.
- Eat local, organic food.
- Recycle your plastic, metal and paper.
- Reuse paper whenever possible before recycling it.
- Bike, skate, walk or use public transportation when possible.
- Use a reusable lunch box instead of paper or plastic bags.
- Use a reusable water bottle instead of juice boxes.
- Get outside! Go on walks, hikes, play in the dirt...
- Compost food waste.
- Talk to your family, friends and teachers about what you are doing to protect our planet.
- Form a club with your friends and neighbors and decide what you can do as a group to $Live\ Blue^{TM}$.
- Pick up litter and dispose of it properly. Less trash on the ground mens less trash that makes it to the ocean.
- Ask questions! Where does your food come from? What plants and animals are your neighbors? What to they need to live healthy lives?
- Eat ocean-friendly seafood.

At Your Aquatic Leisure (Con't)

Family *Live Blue*™ Activities

See how much you can reduce your waste by recycling and compositing. Keep track week to week, month to month:

- Eat a vegetarian meal once a week.
- Plant a windowsill or outdoor garden.
- Host neighborhood swap parties for toys, clothes and other items, instead of buying new ones.
- Learn about local plants and wildlife by creating supportive enviornments near your home (bird feeders, bird baths, etc.).
- What can you make out of trash? See how many items you can use from your recycling bin or trash can to create a sculpture. Is there anything in there that you might be able to use for something else?
- Buy food in bulk instead of individually wrapped portions. Each week set aside time to divide bulk food items into reusable containers to use during the week.
- Mix your own household cleaners kids love to measure and pour, and there are many effective recipes that will clean your house and won't hurt the environment.
- Learn about the environment around you! Sign up for family classes at www.neaq.org/family or with other local environmental organizations.







Try These Activities at Home

Sorting Like a Seal:

Seals often sort objects for fun. Gather 25 objects from around your home and spread them on a table. Sort the objects that are:

- green like a green sea turtle
- spiky like an urchin
- noisy like penguins
- hard like a snail shell

Measure Up:

Grab a measuring tape and string. Then lie on your back and stretch a string from your toes to the top of your head. Now measure pieces of string as long as ocean animals and compare the strings. Who is bigger, you or the animal?

- Giant Pacific octopus: 10 feet (120 inches)
- Epaulette shark: 3 feet (36 inches)
- Little blue penguin: 1 foot (12 inches)
- White shark: 14 feet (168 inches)
